ANNUAL MEETING TO BE HELD NOVEMBER 2 IN MILWAUKEE



### FROM THE DIAGNOSTIC LAB

### Phil Pellitteri

As the field season winds down, it is a good time to reflect on what 1991 was like. There are a number of ways to analyze a given summer and its insect activity. When I compare the number of phone calls I have received or the number of insect specimens that have arrived at my door, I find that I am 20% ahead of last season. Mild winters and extended growing seasons do strange things. We had some documentation of overwinter survival in some insects that was 95% or better. No wonder the phone rang so much!

For the first part of the summer, I could throw my calendar out the door, because almost everything was three weeks ahead of schedule. If you look at the weather data and heat accumulations, it all added up to a great growing season. The extended warmth also allowed many insects to sneak an additional generation in. This created great problems for people that use calendars rather than biological clocks to decide when to begin various control options.

Candidates for insect of the year must include German yellowjackets. Their nasty habit of scavenging for "people food" started very early, around August 1. By early September I got a report from a hospital in Waukesha that one in five of the people arriving at the emergency room had a "bee sting" problem. It was not a pleasant time when you tried to eat outdoors during the day. Baldface hornet nests were also easy to find, with the size of the nests suggesting they had a very strong year also.

A number of "southern insects" did well. An unusual number of calls on praying mantids, cicada killers, catalpa sphinx, euonymus caterpillar and elm leaf beetles made it seem like southern Illinois around here.

This had to be the best year for sphingids I have seen. Lots of talk about various hornworms eating grape leaves, honeysuckle bushes and various broadleaf trees. The late summer brought the "hummingbird" questions. I received a lot of cecropia calls also. There are always people who have never seen or heard of these before, even though they have seen 60 or 70 summers pass by.

The excess moisture brought booklice, foreign grain beetles, mycetophagids and other mold-loving insects out in droves. These things always show up in places they don't belong, such as food products, new homes and even on pets. I must confess, I was hoping for an early frost (mid-August?) to slow some of these insects down, as well as the lawyers that accompany them.

Rounding out the list of insects that had good seasons, I must include various chrysomelid beetles, European earwigs, zebra caterpillar (<u>Melanchra picta</u>), and

all sawflies and ant species I am aware of. The large number of cluster flies that tried to spend the winter with people gave various dermestid beetles such as the larder beetle a good year. We had one sample of insect fauna associated with a murder case, and I must confess that a forensic pathologist makes those of us who run around in fields with butterfly nets seem almost normal.

Around home, we raised luna moths and meadow fritillaries for the first time. My nine year old found out how much caterpillars eat when I left him in charge of feeding them when I was out of state for two weeks. Such is the penance a junior entomologist must suffer.

### New Publication: <u>A Guide to the Clearwing Borers (Sesiidae) of the North Central</u> States. Taft, W.H., Smitley, D. and Snow, J.W. April, 1991. NCR Publication #394.

This publication is intended for naturalists, horticulturists, nurserymen, and extension personnel who need a handy, color reference guide to this difficult to identify group of moths. The topics covered include: identification, host plants, pheromone attractants, trapping techniques, life cycles, flight periods, and economic importance. The guide includes 35 large color plates, six line drawings and three informational tables. Many of the clearwing moths covered in the publication have a geographic range that includes the eastern seaboard and deep south.
